The Elizabeth Glaser Pediatric AIDS Foundation – Kenya seeks the services of an auctioneer to assist the foundation in the organization and execution of a sale of assets (such as motor vehicles) in Homabay, Lodwar, Westpokot, and Kisumu Office.

CONTRACTOR DELIVERABLES

The selected vendor is expected to:

- Organize the assets for auction/sale.
- Document receipt, storage and safeguarding of assets under his/her care against damage and thefts.
- Use a method of sale which is expected to yield the highest possible price.
- Document details of transactions including the sale of assets, selling prices, and sale date.
- Advise foundation on setting reserve prices and other terms of the sale.
- Organize with prospective buyers and foundation on viewing of assets under sale.
- Prepare advertising for sales.

KEY CONTRACT TERMS:

Contract Terms will be presented as a commission percentage. Commission will be calculated as a percentage of gross sales and will be withheld from auction proceeds and paid to the organization within 15 business days after each sale.

EGPAF Kenya expects that no expenses or fees in excess of the agreed upon commission will be billed to the organization for any reason.
