Overview and purpose of the consultancy

The Elizabeth Glaser Pediatric AIDS Foundation, a non-profit organization, is the world leader in the fight to eliminate pediatric AIDS. Our mission is to prevent pediatric HIV infection and to eliminate pediatric AIDS through research, advocacy, and prevention and treatment programs. Through its work in the Sub-Saharan African region, EGPAF has also been progressively and significantly engaging on delivery of tuberculosis (TB) care to the HIV-affected and to the pediatric population, providing technical assistance to national TB programs especially on the underserved area of childhood TB programming.

Through the Catalyzing Pediatric TB Innovations (CaP-TB) project, EGPAF is supporting the roll-out of innovative models of care to improve pediatric TB case finding, diagnosis and treatment of active TB disease and latent TB infection in 9 sub-Saharan African countries (Cameroon, Côte d'Ivoire, DRC, Kenya, Lesotho, Malawi, Tanzania, Uganda and Zimbabwe) and India. This four-year project (2017-2021) is funded by Unitaid.

Civil society and communities play a critical role to overcome access barriers and catalyze uptake of key pediatric TB products and models of care. Through CaP-TB program, EGPAF has provided <u>advocacy small</u> grants to civil society and community organizations in eight countries to scale up innovative diagnostics, drugs, and models of care for pediatric TB.

These grants are informing and promoting national tuberculosis policy reforms where needed, and/or contributing to the implementation and scale up of pediatric TB care. Small grants were provided to ten civil society organizations (CSOs) or community-based organizations (CBOs) and networks in eight countries (Cameroon, Democratic Republic of Congo, India, Kenya, Malawi, Tanzania, Uganda and Zimbabwe). The approach and type of interventions are tailored to national and local specific context and realities.

It is critical to gather lessons learned on the impact of CSOs and CBOs advocacy work on TB advocacy, and reflect on EGPAF's engagement with national CSOs and CBOs on advocacy related work to maximize impact and improve future advocacy projects with CSOs/CBOs on TB.

The ideal candidate will have demonstrated experience in public health related advocacy, as well as good understanding of civil society and community-led advocacy in resource-limited settings, particularly in the African region. The candidate will have the skills and capacity to run interviews, develop and analyze questionnaires / interviews guides, accurately collect, analyze and synthetize information, as well as previous experience in developing quality reports targeting a public health audience.

Regular communication and close collaboration with the EGPAF HQ (Geneva office) and country teams (in Africa) will be required.

Contractor Scope of work:

• Review and familiarize with the ten small grant projects

- Comprehensive desk review of available information produced by the small grants
- Develop and run interviews to gather information from implementers and EGPAF country offices
- Identify impact, high level outcomes, challenges and barriers within the small grants projects.
- Propose high-level recommendations to EGPAF to strengthen its engagement with communities and local civil society organizations when it comes to advocacy.
- Work closely with CaP-TB country and HQ teams along the process to refine the methodology, get feedback and comments and develop high level recommendations and key messages.

Contractor deliverables:

The final deliverable is a multi-country childhood TB community advocacy lessons learned report (in word, text, written in English and already edited / proof-read) that includes main findings and recommendations. The final report will include: outcomes of the small grants, successes & challenges, lessons learned for EGPAF with high level recommendations looking forward. EGPAF will be in charge of the dissemination of the report.
